How long are you going to wait?

I never give St. Paul enough attention. In the second reading today, Paul shares a wonderful truth. God chose us in him, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before him. The profound truth is that we have all been created in Christ. This means that there has been no mistake. This is the plan from the get go. I believe his plan has always been to send his son so that we might see what we will become in him and how to do that (read he is the way, the truth, and the life). As Christ, it is about being one with the trinity. Paul likes to say that we are his adopted children. I am not sure if that word quite translates. We are not his adopted children as if we are something outside of God's creation. We have been God's children from the beginning both good and bad and we will always be God's children. However, he is not going to twist anybody's arm. It is a choice to be with God, and if our desire is to hate him and his creation (which is another way to hate God), he honors our choice to be away from him.

What we call hell. We live in it both now and in the afterlife. The more we live in God's love now; the more we live in heaven both now and in the afterlife and the freer we are now in life. The question for those who hate is how long are you going to live in that hell. How is that separation and isolation working out for you. It's hard to be happy and hate at the same time. Paul beautifully says that "in all wisdom and insight, he has made known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth as a plan in him (Christ) for the fullness of times, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth." What a powerful statement, "to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth." It sounds like universal salvation to me. I believe that God will wait an eternity for us to come home as the pacing father waiting for his son to come home in the story of the prodigal son. The question is how long are you going to choose to live in hell (the pain of separating ourselves from God and one another). When are we going to choose to stop doing our will and choose to do God's will. For some of us that is an experience of exorcism. I am doing the best I can to choose heaven now. I have no desire to wait and the freedom and joy continue to build. For now however, persecution does remain (I don't want to sell a bad bill of goods).







- An online option for those outside the area or those who need a virtual experience;

Using the wisdom of St. Ignatius and a daily commitment to prayer and scripture, each retreatant is given the opportunity to learn different forms of prayer and discover their own prayer style, while being supported and gently challenged by their prayer companion. Above all, they are drawn into a more intimate relationship with God through scripture and the life, ministry, passion and resurrection of Christ.

MORE THAN A PROGRAM OR A COURSE

The genius of the Spiritual Exercises is that, although there is a common tradition and text, no two people experience it in exactly the same way. Rather, through the guidance of the prayer companion and the work of the Holy Spirit, each person's experience will be uniquely theirs. They receive the graces they need depending upon their personal spiritual needs, their openness to the ongoing wisdom inherent in the Exercises, and their awareness of the work of God within them.

Because of this flexibility, Christians of many different denominations and traditions have found the Bridges experience of the Spiritual Exercises to be life-changing and faith-enriching.
