

Do we know better?


This Gospel just makes my head spin. One minute they are praising Jesus, "where did this man get all of this? What kind of wisdom has been given him? What mighty deeds are wrought by his hands!" They were astonished by Jesus. And then they completely turn on him, "is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary, the brother of James, Joses, Judas, and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us? And they took offense at him. They were amazed by Jesus, but they end up dismissing him and what he says. Their excuse is that Jesus cannot be this wise and powerful person because they knew him before all of this. They knew better. Never mind the wisdom that he spoke and the deeds that he had done. He even managed to cure a few sick people in a disbelieving town. Jesus is amazed by their lack of faith

What is it that we dismiss about Jesus because we know better. He always went to the poor first. Jesus worked from the bottom up. Notice, he always went to the bottom. The first beatitude was blessed are the poor. In the foot washing he taught us to be servants first. In our society we support a top down approach. Everything is built around the rich. The system supports the rich. It is not a fair system. In the great recession who were saved, the rich. A lot of rich people think they know better. A lot of people even in the church think they know better. Serving the poor should be a top priority for us as Christians. What are the top priorities in our lives? Is serving the poor one of them?

What about not just the poor, but the outcast. Jesus was always reaching out to the outcast and bringing them into His community. He brought in women who were considered second class citizens. He brought in lepers who were unclean. He brought in the lame. They were considered to be sinners. He brought in tax collectors and prostitutes. When it comes to people, we think we know better. We judge others. Who would Jesus be with in this day and age? All that we have to do is think about those who are different. We all work with people who have a different ethnicity or a different religion? We all know people who have different politics. We all have that family member or relative who has a different orientation. Are we welcoming them into our communities? Or do we hold final judgment?

Jesus called us to live a simple life. He focused on his relationships, his relationship with God and with us. That what was his life's work. There sure are a lot of people who think they know better. We fill every moment of the day with activity. We especially do this with our children. We have so many activities scheduled for them. We find ourselves teaching our children how to run away from God and how to run away from themselves. How are we to really connect with others if we can't just be with ourselves? Are we simplifying our lives or are we running?





# What Are The Spiritual Exercises?

At Bridges, we invite retreatants to experience the ancient wisdom of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius Loyola in a way that will transform their contemporary lives of faith. We're here to be the connection—the bridge—that helps them see and respond to the movements of God. The Bridges retreat takes place over the course of 8 months each year from September through May.

#### Here's what is involved:

The opportunity to have a full experience of the Spiritual Exercises over an 8-month period, as envisioned and created by St. Ignatius, the founder of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits).

- A commitment to about an hour of prayer each day, following a modern translation of the original text.
- Personalized, one-on-one guidance from an experienced, trained prayer companion.
- Weekly or monthly small community meetings at several locations throughout the St. Louis metropolitan area;
- An online option for those outside the area or those who need a virtual experience;

Using the wisdom of St. Ignatius and a daily commitment to prayer and scripture, each retreatant is given the opportunity to learn different forms of prayer and discover their own prayer style, while being supported and gently challenged by their prayer companion. Above all, they are drawn into a more intimate relationship with God through scripture and the life, ministry, passion and resurrection of Christ.

#### MORE THAN A PROGRAM OR A COURSE

The genius of the Spiritual Exercises is that, although there is a common tradition and text, no two people experience it in exactly the same way. Rather, through the guidance of the prayer companion and the work of the Holy Spirit, each person's experience will be uniquely theirs. They receive the graces they need depending upon their personal spiritual needs, their openness to the ongoing wisdom inherent in the Exercises, and their awareness of the work of God within them.

Because of this flexibility, Christians of many different denominations and traditions have found the Bridges experience of the Spiritual Exercises to be life-changing and faith-enriching.
