Calming the Storms in Life

It was one of those stormy days in the Spring when the weathercasters were predicting the Storm Apocalypse. Schools were being released early. On one such day the storms were raging, and the lightning was crashing, and the thunder was roaring. The kids were being released. I remember one of the primary kids was crying. I was clueless, not understanding why the kid was crying as I tried to console the kid. The teacher remarked that the kid was crying in fear of the storm.

We encounter many terrible storms in life. In the Gospel, the disciples risk losing their lives in the sea. A violent squall came up and the waves were threatening to sink their boats. They were in a panic. They had forgotten one important thing. They forgot that God was in the boat with them, that Jesus was in the boat with them. One of them came to their senses and woke Jesus. Jesus commanded the sea, "Quiet! Be still." The storm and the wind ceased.

The storm is a metaphor for the great difficulties in life. We forget don't we when the storms roar in our life that there is one who has the power to calm the storms. How often I am in a panic and forget to turn to the Lord. How often do I have to learn this lesson. The challenge is to realize that we are not alone in our difficulties and that there is one who can calm everything. Even when we are causing the storm, if we turn to him, he still has the power to calm the storm.

What are those times that we forget that God is in the boat with us? Maybe it's when there is a deadline, maybe it's when we have lost a job, maybe it's when we are sick, maybe it's when we lost a loved one, maybe it's when we have done something wrong and really hurt ourselves. If we just turn to the Lord, I am not going to say it's easy, but we might begin to have calm, and this too shall pass. Can we realize that God is in the boat, that God loves us, forgives us, brings healing and brings new hope? Maybe things are going well in our life, can we be the calm in other people's lives? Can we be the reminder that God is in our lives and loves us and will bring new life?




Prayer on the Anniversary of the Overturning of Roe v. Wade

JUNE IS GUN VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH

The Lesser-Known Side of Gun Violence


Most people are surprised to learn that nearly 60% of all adult gun deaths are suicide by gun. Today, the rate of firearm suicides is at an all-time high in the US...12 times the gun suicide rate in other high-income countries.



The dynamics of suicide are complex, but research indicates that a combination of several risk factors is often present in the lead-up to suicide, namely current life stressors, historical risk factors, and access to lethal means of harm such as firearms. Nearly 90% of suicide attempts with a firearm are fatal, compared to 5% of all other suicide attempts.

As we hear in today's Psalm, the Lord heard their distress and hushed the storm. As God is present to us, may we be present to others who are suffering and who may be at risk for suicide, particularly by using a firearm. Using gun locks or securing firearms in a gun safe can reduce the risk of suicide by gun during an emotional, impulsive response to a stressful situation. Also, removing guns from the home when we are concerned that an adult or child in the household may be at risk for self-harm is one of the easiest and quickest ways to intervene, while encouraging the individual to seek professional help.

If you are concerned that someone you know – or you yourself – may be considering suicide, the 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline offers 24/7 support by trained counselors.
