



How can we be forgiven, if we can not even acknowledge the truth of our wrongs when we don't want to be forgiven? Jesus arms are wide open with the truth and love, but will we want to embrace the truth or prefer our lies. The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of Truth. On the contrary, Satan is the prince of lies.



JUNE IS GUN VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH - WEAR ORANGE WEEKEND

Wear Orange is a movement to honor victims and survivors of gun violence and to raise awareness of the impact of gun violence. Wear Orange began in 2013 by friends of Hadiya Pendleton. Hadiya joyfully marched in President Obama's second inaugural parade. One week later, she was shot and killed on a playground in Chicago. Soon after this tragedy, Hadiya's friends commemorated her life by wearing orange, the color hunters wear in the woods to protect themselves and others.

President Obama himself said... "I do not accept that we cannot find a commonsense way to preserve our traditions, including our basic second amendment freedoms and the rights of law-abiding gun owners, while at the same time reducing the gun violence that unleashes so much mayhem on a regular basis."



To accomplish this will require moral courage and selflessness from our political leaders at every level, AND our Prayers, Advocacy, and Votes. As we hear in today's Gospel, "...if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand." So, instead, let us stand together in solidarity this weekend with many Americans who are wearing orange in tribute to the more than 43,000 Americans killed with guns and the 76,000 more who are shot and wounded each year.
